## Project IC Case012/15 Demolition

**Descriptor:** Revise level 2 and new Level 3

DESCRIPTION	
<p>The Federation would like to propose a change to the structure of the level 2 qualification in order to align it with changes in industry needs and to align it with their CCDO industry card scheme. This change to the structure will include reducing the number of core mandatory units to 3 and having one mandatory optional and one further optional unit. This will make a total of 5 units for this award, but still keeping it as a Diploma.</p>	
<p>Following revisions to the Demolition card scheme the industry have identified a need for a NEW level 3 qualification to meet the needs of its revised scheme. This qualification will provide evidence of competence at the Chargehand grade on the revised scheme. Previously the scheme has the supervisor grade but industry felt there was a gap between the Topman card and the supervisor. Therefore they have proposed that the Topman card becomes the Chargehand to fill the gap between a non-working supervisor and the site team. The proposed structure is based on existing units, with 5 core units and provides a pathway for the Chargehand and the Supervisor through optional units. It is expected that in the first year there will be a reasonable number of people taking the qualification building up over time.</p>
