- 5. Frameworks used to procure interim staff in this area

My response is as follows:

1. Total number of staff

21 head count; 16.8 Full-time equivalents (FTE)

2. Total number of SCS1 finance staff

Not relevant. CITB is a Non-Departmental Public Body and does not use the Civil Service pay bands.

3. Department structure

Our Finance Director has nine direct reports (one Financial Controller, one Head of Business Planning, six Finance Business Partners, one Project Accountant) and eleven indirect reports (two in to the Financial Controller, one in to the Head of Business Planning, six in to one of the Business Partners and one each in to two more of the Business Partners)

4. Total number of agency workers / contractors (please include those on fixed term contract but not internal secondment)

The above figures include two agency staff.

5. Frameworks used to procure interim staff in this area

We use both Brook Street and Capita as neutral vendors to supply temporary workers to CITB.
